#### 4. MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

RESOLVED that the Minutes of the meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> October 2016 were approved as a correct record.

At 18:35, at the request of the Chair, standing orders were suspended and the meeting adjourned for a period of up to 10 minutes to enable Cllr Shaw to arrive. Cllr Shaw had indicated he was on his way but had been held up.

The meeting continued at 18:45 with Cllr Shaw in attendance.

# 5. TREASURER'S REPORT AND FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT 30<sup>th</sup> NOVEMEMBER 2016

The Town Clerk reported that the Council's finances were in a good position and not overspent.

Cllrs were content with the report, and did not raise any issues.

#### RESOLVED that:

1. The Treasurer's Report and Financial Statements as at 30<sup>th</sup> November 2016 be noted.

#### 6. BUDGET 2017-18

The Town Clerk presented a report concerning the 2017/18 Budget, which contained a number of options for councillors to consider.

The Town Clerk presented information regarding the national position of Maghull Town Council in comparison with other Parish and Town Councils. In summary

- Dunstable Town Council had the highest level of precept at £2,117,238 (Band D £175.21)
- Maghull Town Council is 109<sup>th</sup> on the list of highest setting precepts
- South Kirkby and Moorthorpe Town Council (Wakefield) has the highest Band D charge at £311.05 (Precept £842,000)
- Maghull Town Council is 586<sup>th</sup> on the list of highest Band D charges
- Sutton Coalfield Town Council (created 2016) has the largest tax base of 36,501
- Maghull Town Council is 174<sup>th</sup> on the list of highest tax bases.
- Maghull Town Council precept has not been raised since 2011
- The Bank of England inflation calculator gives an average inflation rate of 2.3% since 2011. If the precept had risen in line with inflation from 2011 the precept would be as follows:

The Town Clerk confirmed that rent generated from the proposed community police station located within Maghull Town Hall had been incorporated into the 2017/18 budget.

The Town Clerk went on to discuss each option in turn, and invited members' views; these included:-

- · Agreement that Option 5 was preferred;
- Agreement that any income generated should be reinvested for the benefit of the community in terms of events, facilities improvement or new facilities;
- Officers should continue in the production of business plans to clearly showing how Maghull Town Council will move forward and what resource is required;
- As a matter of urgency, consultation is required with groups affected by charge increase, and determination of how effects of charge may be ameliorated;

#### **RESOLVED that:**


- 1. Option 5 of the report was the preferred option;
- 2. Option 5 would be recommended to Full Council at their next meeting;
- 3. That the report was noted.

#### 7. CHAIR'S REPORT

Chair confirmed that he has met with officers who are in the process of developing business plans which will continue to be worked through.

Given Council's recent adoption of the power of general competence, it was intended that Maghull Community Enterprises would act as a trading company for Maghull Town Council. This would require the company be sold to the council, with articles and membership also requiring review.

This would be worked through with the Town Clerk and Operations, Contracts & Business Development Manager in the coming months.

#### 7. 2017/18 Grounds Maintenance Schedule & Contracts

#### Parks & Open Spaces

Maghull Town Council will commence its 2017/18 grounds maintenance operations in mid-March 2017.

13 parks and 18 open spaces are currently maintained by Maghull Town Council.

Operatives will work to a service standard of fortnightly visits to parks and open spaces; and provide an "all in one visit" service encompassing grass cutting, strimming, blowing, edging and litter removal. Visits may however be negatively impacted by weather and/or mechanical breakdown.

#### **Grounds Maintenance Contracts**

Council's adoption of the power of general competence has authorised the council to generate profit from its private grounds maintenance operations.

Whilst Maghull Town Council has entered into works for a number of organisations, income has always been on a cost recovery basis.

Private grounds maintenance contracts awarded during 2016/17 have been successfully renegotiated for 2017/18. As a result, income of circa £30,000.00 will be generated.

To date, five private grounds maintenance contracts have been agreed. Further quotes for works will be submitted during the year.

#### **Grounds Maintenance Schedule 2017/18**

To ensure council meets its service standards for parks & open spaces; and its obligations under ground maintenance contracts, the following schedule has been developed for 2017/18.

The schedule offers sufficient flexibility for parks & opens spaces insofar as operatives are not expected to maintain a specific park on a specific day. Instead, flexibility is provided through a rolling maintenance programme – with an ethos of completing one park, before moving onto the next on the rota.

This approach accommodates factors beyond our control such as inclement weather and/or mechanical breakdown.

More rigidity applies to the council's grounds maintenance contracts. A specific number of officers are expected to attend site, on a specific day and for a specific length of time. Whilst factors beyond our control may intervene, the council is bound to complete its obligations at the earliest opportunity.

As a result, two schedules will operate at the same time - a schedule for parks & open spaces, and a schedule for grounds maintenance contracts. These are stated in Appendix One.

Before grounds maintenance operations commence in mid-March, the schedule will be implemented to both assess and address operational issues, and to hit the ground running before the growing season starts in earnest.

This schedule will be published on the Maghull Town Council website. Any queries or complaints will be monitored and addressed by the Council's Operations, Contracts and Business Development Manager.

#### 11. Running Horses Football Club

Members will be aware that Running Horses Football Club have put forward a proposal to renovate Maghull Town Council's storage hut located within Ballswood, Maghull.

In its current condition, the storage hut is unusable and unsafe for public use. However, should the proposal be adopted and renovations completed; the storage hut would be transformed into changing facilities for the exclusive use of the club.

Maghull Town Council has worked closely with representatives of the club; and based on market value, an annual rent for exclusive use has now been agreed.

An inspection of the clubs accounts has also been completed. No concerns have been raised relating to club funds, ability to pay for renovations and ability to meet rent charges and utility charges.

Sefton Council Legal Services are now in the process of developing heads of terms following the submission of documents supporting the proposal.

Heads of terms will be reported back to this committee and Running Horses Football Club; with renovation works likely to commence at the beginning of the new financial year.
